She is a fellow of the American-Speech-Language-Hearing Association (ASHA), holds Specialty Recognition in Child Language, and has received the Honors of the ASHA and the Distinguished Alumnus Award from Geneva College and the University of Iowa. She has published and presented nationally and internationally on theory of mind, language-literacy relationships, narrative/expository development and facilitation, assessment and facilitation of written language, and issues in assessment and intervention with culturally/linguistically diverse populations. She has been principal investigator on a number of clinical service, research, and personnel preparation grants, including Project BRIDGE (Building Reading in Diverse Groups in Education), that prepared graduate students in speech-language pathology to work within classrooms to facilitate language-literacy development of children from Hispanic and Native American backgrounds and Project PLAY (Play and Language Attunement in Young Children) that trained caregivers to increase the quality and frequency of interactions that promote development of theory of mind and language. She has PhD in Speech Pathology from the University of Iowa.

Deborah J. Wilson is a consultant for Bilingual Multicultural Services to students who are Deaf and Hard-of-hearing in the Santa Fe Public Schools. 

About the Conference

Centre for Assistive Technology & Innovation (CATI), NISH, Thiruvananthapuram is collaborating with IEEE Humanitarian Activities Committee (HAC) and Kerala Development and Innovation Strategic Council (K-DISC) to organize 'Forging the Assistive Technology Value Chain' in January 18-19, 2019.

The event will bring together the various stakeholders in the AT value chain: from researchers and product developers to users who are people with disability. We hope that providing a common platform will encourage a conversation between them to address the challenges in building an AT ecosystem in India. A public exhibit of AT products with stalls by different organizations will let the participants immerse in the world of AT.

Programme Overview: The sessions have been broadly categorized under the following topics:

AT Co-creation: Successful AT solutions can only result from the 'participatory design' approach, where all the stakeholders are actively involved in the design process to make sure that the results can meet the needs and is usable. We present examples where technology developers 'co-create' AT solutions with the end users from Disabled People's Organizations (DPOs).

AT Training and Implementation: Abandonment of AT devices is a serious problem, which can be addressed by an effective service delivery model and measuring the outcomes. Assessment, matching the right device with user, providing trial options, device customization, training and follow-up are critical to ensure that the last mile implementation difficulties are reduced. We have a plethora of speakers with immense experience in working hand-in-hand with the end users to implement AT.

AT Commercialization: There is not enough 'market-pull' for AT products as the market is fragmented. The end-users are not aware of the available technologies and also lack the purchasing power. In India, especially, the AT ecosystem is nearly non-existent. We have picked some examples of how some adventurous people have found their way to create an impact in such a scenario with their innovative products.

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

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



Dr Carol Westby

Dr Carol Westby is a consultant for Bilingual Multicultural Services in Albuquerque, NM and an affiliated professor at Brigham Young University in Provo, UT. She is a fellow of the American-Speech-Language-Hearing Association (ASHA), holds Specialty Recognition in Child Language, and has received the Honors of the ASHA and the Distinguished Alumnus Award from Geneva College and the University of Iowa. She has published and presented nationally and internationally on theory of mind, language-literacy relationships, narrative/expository development and facilitation, assessment and facilitation of written language, and issues in assessment and intervention with culturally/linguistically diverse populations. She has been principal investigator on a number of clinical service, research, and personnel preparation grants, including Project BRIDGE (Building Reading in Diverse Groups in Education), that prepared graduate students in speech-language pathology to work within classrooms to facilitate language-literacy development of children from Hispanic and Native American backgrounds and Project PLAY (Play and Language Attunement in Young Children) that trained caregivers to increase the quality and frequency of interactions that promote development of theory of mind and language. She has PhD in Speech Pathology from the University of Iowa.

Deborah J. Wilson is a consultant for Bilingual Multicultural Services to students who are Deaf and Hard-of-hearing in the Santa Fe Public Schools. 
